The end of the financial year for the Parish is fast approaching. Hopefully, soon after the 30th June, we will present the annual accounts to the Auditors, and once they have reported, we will present them to you, the parishioners.

However, a quick update might be appropriate now, before people head off on summer holidays to enjoy endless hours of unbroken sun in Ireland, or abroad.

The Parish finances are reasonably healthy, and much improved since this time last year. The Parish's only source of income is the Family offering. It has been maintained in 2013 at the same level as in 2012. We are appreciative of all those who do contribute.

I remain convinced that some parishioners, who contribute weekly to collections taken at up Mass, do so in the belief that in some way the parish benefits financially. It is worth repeating that the Christmas and Easter dues and the First and Second collections at Mass are all Diocesan collections. NO part of which accrues to the Parish. They are collections, which are totally worthy of our support but I believe that it is important to remind parishioners that a contribution to them is not a contribution to St. Brigid's parish.

Your support is still needed, both to assist in the reduction and ultimate elimination of the debt, which stands as of now at €250,000, but also to help us utilise the wonderful facility, which the Centre undoubtedly is.

Commercial entities should also find our rates very attractive, and we have parking available for those using the Centre.

With your help, the good news story will continue, and next year I hopefully I will report an even better story.
