Happy Easter

"Happy Easter" ... is a greeting that easily trips off the tongue at this time of the year. It's almost an automatic thing to say. But even for committed Christians the greeting can easily and ritually be extended without really reflecting on what it is meant to convey. What we celebrate at this time of the year is much greater than what could possibly be put into any formula of words or greeting in any language.

The essence of the Easter story confounds those on either side of the 'leap of faith'. The truth of what we celebrate as Christians defies all logic; it reduces to nonsense its central claim when that claim is filtered through the sieve of human sense or intelligence, as some like to do! But not everyone has to be that blinkered.

Some people suggest it baffles the bewildered and at the same time it bewilders the baffled and how right they are! How could it do anything else when in essence its claim is 'death is not the end'. To claim that, out of the darkness and sadness of death can come a light of hope, and to suggest that when all else has obviously failed there's still a hope onto which we can hold. This is extra-ordinary — in the literal sense!

Now if that's not enough to properly situate our boast in Jesus the Christ, risen from the dead this Easter, I don't know what is!!

Talk about 'nailing your flag to the mast' has nothing on 'nailing your hope to a tree' in terms of wanting to convey a conviction which is so deeply held. Enjoy the season, profit from its promise.

May the truth of this Easter season — Jesus risen from the dead — be both a challenge and a comfort in equal measure for us. That way we're most likely to keep our balance, while so many around us are losing theirs, in terms of Faith in a God who is Love and who is close.

Age Friendly Neighbourhood

A meeting of Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council's Age Friendly Programme was also held recently in Cabinteely where themes of respect and social inclusion, safety and security, communication and information, among others, were discussed.

One of the main outcomes of the gathering indicated that Cabinteely is a good place in which to live, with a generally very caring community, with facilities such as shops, transport and other services on which we all depend, reasonably accessible.

The importance of protecting your home, and person, was stressed. Foremost in this regard is prevention — make it more difficult for an intruder to gain access. Under no circumstances permit people into your home that you do not know. The best protection is having a good neighbour, one on whom you can depend, in an emergency. Neighbourhood Watch is also soon to be re-established in the area.



Kenya Project 2015

This project involves seven students and three members of staff from the school travelling to Kitale, Kenya and engaging with the street children in St. Ursula's Primary School starting on Monday 14th until March 26th.

To date, Cabinteely Community School has enabled the building of a kitchen in the school, a playground, science lab and basketball courts for an Aids orphans school. This was made possible with continued support from schools, parishes and businesses in the local and wider Dublin Community.

We would like to thank the parishioners of St. Brigid's for all your donations at our Strawberry sale last August and ask you to remember us and our work in your prayers.



Church Cleaning

Another very important ministry/group in St. Brigid's is ensured by that faithful group of parishioners whose time, regular interest and energy go into the cleaning of our Church building.
