Full steam ahead!

As the turbulent and sometimes choppy waters of trying to manage the practicalities of parish life reflected themselves for the Pastoral Parish Council members over the last twelve months, with the absence of Fr. Arthur, we are now happily into the calmer waters of a safe and secure harbour, from which we are ready to set sail once more.

With Fr. Aquinas now on the bridge ready to steer St. Brigid's for the next years' voyages – we owe a great deal of thanks to the existing Parish Pastoral Council as they prepare to take some well-earned 'shore-leave' in preparation for a 'new' crew to sign up in helping to charter this new chapter which we are beginning at this time.

Within official parochial 'grouping' set up by the Archbishop in October of this year, the pastoral care of the three parishes is under the care of Fr. Frank Herron, Moderator of the Team (resident in Foxrock); Fr. Aquinas T Duffy, Co-Parish Priest (resi-

Money matters

In recent years, throughout the Diocese, there has been a consistent reduction in the level of income received by the Church and Cabinteely is no exception. Costs remain high, and managing our finances is not easy.

Parishioners often ask where the money, so generously contributed is actually spent. In Cabinteely, we had a very substantial debt as a result of building our Parish centre. Clearing that debt was a priority, along with trying to maintain the level of service, which St. Brigid's provides to the community.

The past 12 months has seen a continuing decline, little by little, in our income, and it is therefore very heartening to report that we are very likely to see that debt all but eliminated in the next 12 to 18 months. It now stands at under €50,000. Our only source of income is the parishioners, through the Family Offering. We have in recent years offered the parishioners the opportunity to contribute otherwise than by way of regular weekly or monthly payments. The "Orange Envelopes" appear once a month and represent a very valuable additional source to the Parish. Last year, at Christmas, we invited parishioners, who wished to do so, to contribute directly to the Parish in a special envelope, distributed at the same time as the Christmas Dues envelope. We are repeating that in the current year.

Those funds, as well as going to meet our obligations to the bank, also pay the running costs of dent in Cabinteely); Fr. John Sinnott, Co-Parish Priest (resident in Johnstown-Killiney); Fr. Gerard Doyle, Co-Parish Priest (resident in Johnstown-Killiney); Fr. Arthur O'Neill, Team Assistant (resident in Cabinteely); and Rev. Deacon Jeremy Seligman (resident in Cabinteely).

We are also fortunate that in addition to Fr. Arthur being available to assist when he can, Fr. Tom and Monsignor John Fitzpatrick are resident as retired priests in the parish.

The Clergy and parish council members of all three parishes will be 'sailing' in tandem with each other, working and sharing our talents, personnel and experiences for the betterment of all. Each of our parishes reflects our Christian identity in the rich and diverse resource of talent and willingness of all our volunteers, that together witness so powerfully to our Faith in a God of Love - alive in the hearts of the Faithful. Long may it continue for all of us.

the Parish, the salaries of the parish staff, maintenance and repair of the Church and the Centre, as well as contributing to community services and projects.

We had increased operational costs resulting from Fr. Arthur's indisposition, and these have been met, partly by the parish and partly with the support of the Diocese through the Diocesan Common Fund.

The First and Second collections at Sunday Masses and the Christmas and Easter Dues, are Diocesan collections. No part of those collections is retained in the Parish.

The Second collection, the Share Collection, is used to assist parishes who require financial support and it also meets the administrative costs of the Diocese.

The First Collection goes to the Common Fund, which pays the salaries of working and retired priests of the Diocese, including our own priests in St. Brigid's. It also looks after the health insurance for the priests of the Diocese and meets the maintenance and medical expenses of those no longer in active ministry.

While the Family Offering, including the additional methods of contribution mentioned above, is our only income in the Parish, and with your continued support we can in the very near future eliminate our bank debt, and continue to increase the level of support we can, as a Parish, assist those who are providing much needed community services. **DM**
