

What a relief!

Thank you to all who have returned completed Tax Relief forms to the parish. As a result of a change in the law the parish has been given the opportunity to avail itself of a substantial new source of income.

There is no longer any tax relief given to a taxpayer who makes a donation to a charity but, where any taxpayer contributes €250 or more to a charity (which includes St. Brigid's), in any year, the charity can claim a substantial tax refund. All that is necessary is that the contributor completes a form and

returns it to the charity. The refund can amount to as much as an additional €112 in respect of each €250 donated, and it costs the taxpayer nothing!! It will represent a very significant addition to the income of the
