Not long ago a good friend shared a story about how he discovered this little slice of serenity (excuse the pun) shortly after his wife of many years had passed away. He talked about the experience of visiting her grave in Deansgrange the day after the funeral and understandably was feeling a bit at a loss and wondering 'where do I go from here?' He found himself walking through the doors of the nearby Tea Rooms, situated at the entrance of the cemetery. As he sat down he was warmly welcomed and a short time later he was enjoying a cafetiere of freshly brewed coffee and a sweet treat on the side! This teashop turned out to be a valuable source of encounter and comfort

in the weeks and months that followed and still remains so!

As it turned out, my friend's warm greeting that day had been offered by Patricia Neylon, the person behind the concept and the tearooms Manager and Chef. She is clearly someone who gives her customers so much more then any 'work' title might suggest.

Patricia's personal imprint is evident from the moment you step into the atmosphere of calm and homeliness. The premises are bright and comfortable and on a recent visit it felt like I was walking into someone's home. The walls are covered with a wonderful collection of original art work, chosen by Patricia and purchased from participants in Sunbeams House Art initiatives and exhibitions.

There's a buzz and chatter about the place... the rooms are invariably busy with locals dropping by, and also those who are visiting the cemetery, but the clientele also includes many from further afield prompted to call in following a recommendation or review. Some people are reading quietly in a corner, some are playing board games, while others are talking in small groups. I was struck that I wouldn't feel out of place on my own, but if you are open to a little company this is the place to be!


Patricia sat down for a chat in between many busy moments looking after everyone who came through the door. Her workday begins at 5.30am with the baking and preparing of cakes and scones and other light snacks. The coffee is freshly ground and she always serves leaf tea. Everything on offer is made daily and is locally sourced where at all possible. While Patricia and her hard working team of co-workers

Fiona, Rachel and Sarah are certainly running a successful business, it's clear their priorities lie in delivering that 'something more'

Before I left some of her regulars shared what makes this café so special. "She doesn't realize the value she gives; the food of course is excellent, but Patricia's aim is also providing an environment where all feel welcomed and part of a community who cares about them."

St. Brigid's Parish Choir

The present St. Brigid's Choir made its debut over 20 years ago, in February 1995, and since then has enhanced the parish liturgy both at Sunday mass and at all the major ceremonies and liturgical celebrations during the church year.

In that time our choir has broadcast on RTE Television and Radio on many occasions and represented the Dublin diocese at a special pilgrimage for the sick to Knock Shrine, providing music for the ceremony in the basilica. The choir has also joined with choirs from neighbouring parishes and with local singers, in ecumenical services and in a memorable concert performance of Fauré's Requiem in our parish church.

With a current membership of 25 very dedicated singers, the choir embraces a wide repertoire from plainchant and early music through to contemporary liturgical compositions.

Active participation by the congregation is encouraged at all liturgies. Our six cantors, who are also full-time choir members, lead the singing at the 6.30 p.m. Saturday vigil and 10 a.m. Sunday masses. We are also very fortunate to have a pipe organ designed and built specially for our church by Neiland and Creane, Organ Builders of Wexford, in 1995. It was overhauled in 2014 and adds hugely to the musical life of the parish.

As autumn is upon us and the choir returns from its summer break, we look forward to a new season of music and song. New choir members are always welcome and can chat with the choir after the 10 a.m. Sunday mass.

In the words of an old saying, to sing is to pray twice - and St. Brigid's Choir certainly takes that to heart in its contribution to the spiritual and liturgical life of our parish.
