Claude Snyde always arrived at St John's a good ten minutes early each Sunday. It gave him time to browse through the papers at the back of church without having to buy them.

It was second nature to him to dip his fingers into the holy water font and make the Sign of the Cross, though he rarely thought about what he was doing because he was usually checking that no one had taken his customary seat in his favourite pew. Though taught as a boy how to genuflect, he now made what looked more like a curtsey as he wobbled on one knee. Sitting in the pew allowed him to take in the whole scene. Why did that large family insist on sitting close to the front? Presumably so that the children could see what was going on and feel part of things; but their restlessness seemed to Claude to make the place untidy.

As the music leader began to teach a simple refrain to the congregation he began to read the parish newsletter. He never sang. That was for others.

When things got started he slipped into his familiar robotic routine of giving the responses: Lord, have mercy... Amen... Thanks be to God. They all tripped off his tongue in an unintentional fashion. He put a small offering on the collection plate as it passed and settled down to examining the dress of those in the bench in front of him. Why did some people come to church in clothes more suited to an afternoon's gardening? The priest should say something about it, he mused.

In the procession going up to communion he wondered if some of the people really ought to be receiving the sacrament, since he knew one or two of them to be decidedly shady characters. And it irritated him that the priest should spend so long in silent prayer after communion instead of finishing off the proceedings. Still, it allowed him to complete his reading of the newsletter. And when it was all over he didn't go for coffee with everyone else in the parish hall. He reckoned that he'd been there for an hour already, and that's all that was required of him.


