Unless a person totally allows the weeds to reign, there is always to be found at least a small measure of faith, good, light, and love. With even this small portion, God can produce abundant growth.

Admittedly, it is easy to give into the weeds, and they grow very quickly. Any gardener knows this to be true. Sometimes, the weeds even seem more attractive and vibrant. Dealing with weeds can quickly become a losing battle, and they can look healthier and grow faster than the very plants we are trying to protect. It's easy to give into them and let them win. While God will deal with all things in due time, we are responsible for keeping things in check in the short term. It is our task to keep our eyes fixed on God's presence and mercy. We are asked to avoid judgment. And, it is not our responsibility to deal with the weeds in someone else's garden, only our own. One garden is enough responsibility for anyone.

Weeds have power. We have to realize this. While they can appear attractive and healthy, they can quickly choke us off from God's presence. Our task is one of maintenance and cultivating a desire for God. Even the smallest kernel of faith can grow into something wonderful. In God's time, the eternal harvest will come, and we will no longer have to worry about the weeds.

Phased Re-Opening of St. Brigid's Church



Let's Begin Together

We reopened with the first Public Mass on Monday 6th July. We had a full complement with 50 people present. Throughout the rest of the week we had an average daily attendance of 28. On Sunday we can only accommodate 70 and with families in the one bench can take up to 100 (50 below and 50 above). There will be just one Sunday mass at **10 AM** for now. We are asking people, where possible, to attend at the weekday Mass rather than on Sunday.

We continue to appeal for volunteers for the role of stewards required for midweek and Sunday mass. Thank You to those who have already responded. If you would like to put your name forward just email the Parish Office info@cabinteelyparish.ie or phone 01-2858835.

We ask People to continue to

- *Follow the directions of the Stewards:
- *Practice social distancing,
- *Sanitise hands on the way in and out;
- *Enter by front door and exit by side chapel door;
- *Wear a face covering in the Church where possible;
- *Holy Communion will be distributed after Mass as you are leaving the Church;
- *No congregational singing,
- *Provision of Tea afterwards is suspended for now
- *Use of the Bathroom is by request:

*If you not feeling well please do not come to the Church; *If you have any underlying medical conditions you may wish to continue watching Mass via our web cam.

St Brigid's Church has been treated with Re-Active Barrier Technology.

The Church was misted with a chemical solution that kills all germs on contact. Additionally, when the solution dries a barrier is created. If subsequent germs are re-introduced to the surface the solution reactivates and eradicates those germs and viruses immediately, thus providing protection between cleans.

First Holy Communion and Confirmations
